The following is a description (an email I composed immediately following the election) of what I encountered as we “voted” the online military ballots.....

I am an election judge in Douglas County Colorado. In general, our county processes are very good and secure. However, I was working on the online voting for military and overseas voters. This is the only situation our county uses an online platform for voting. Election judges take a print out of the online ballot and we (a team of 1 Dem and 1 Repub) “vote” onto a scannable ballot. Then ballot is given to a counterpart from opposite party and checked. The in house process is very good and has many checks and balances. The issue was that in a “batch” there was consistently few few (maybe only 1-2) ballots voted as republican. Each batch was 50-100 votes. I did this judging over 2 days (I was a substitute Judge) and probably processed 20-30 batches. It just seemed very unrealistic. I brought this to the attention of the election managers who were not concerned. Since we live in a highly republican based area (trump won the presidential race here) and given these were mostly military votes, it didn’t seem correct. This obviously won’t affect the outcome in Colorado, but I’m wondering if perhaps this could be true in other places as well?

Again, thank you for looking into this. As I mentioned, my background is programming and specifically data storage. I would love to be of any assistance to your efforts that I can be.
